The entire Tea was under the general chairmanship of Penny Pilotti, Co-Director of Social Activities of the Junior Class.

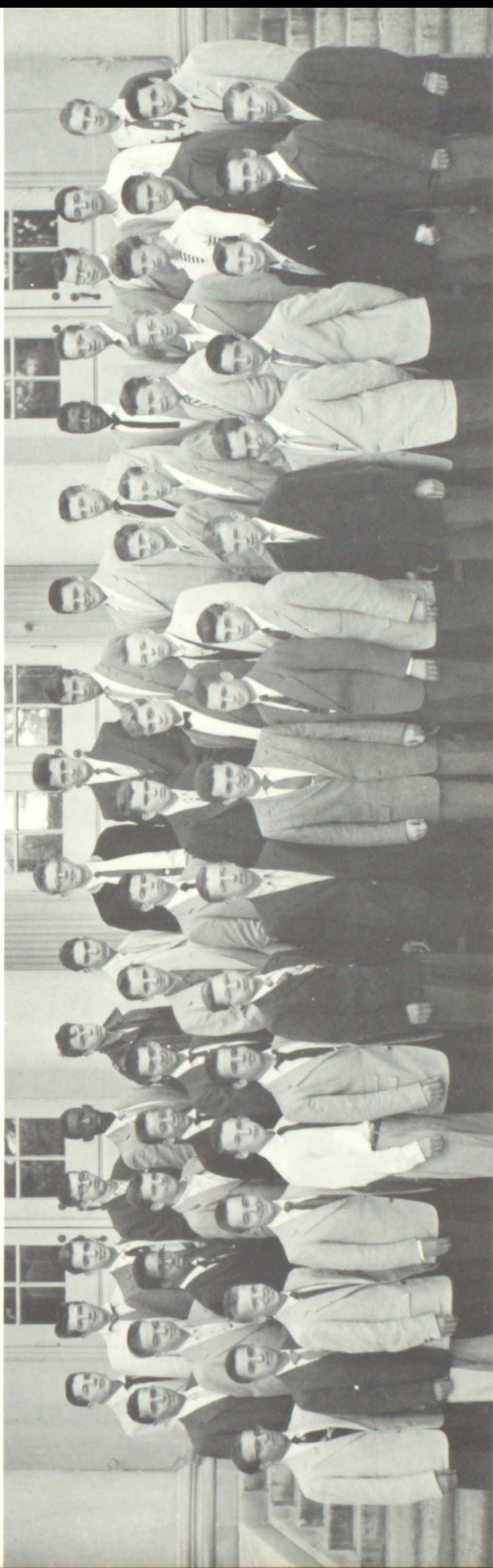

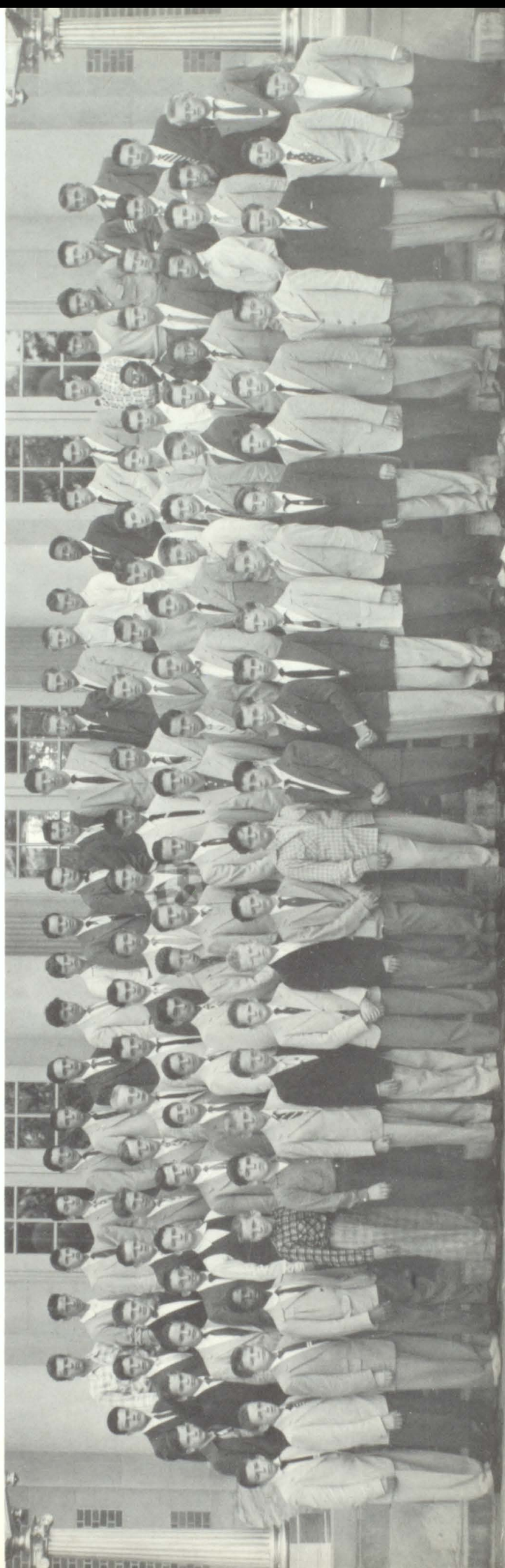

CHORUS

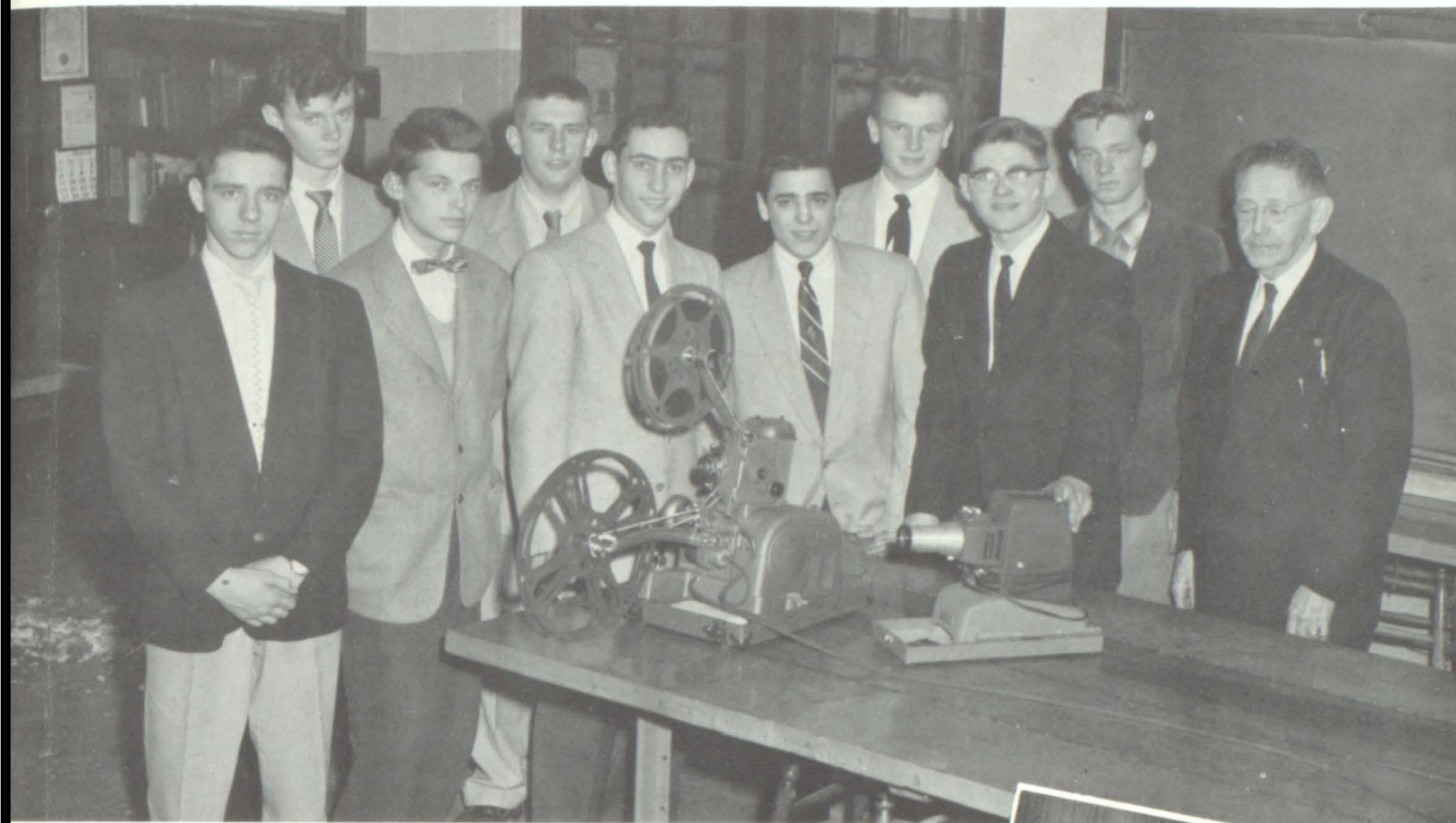

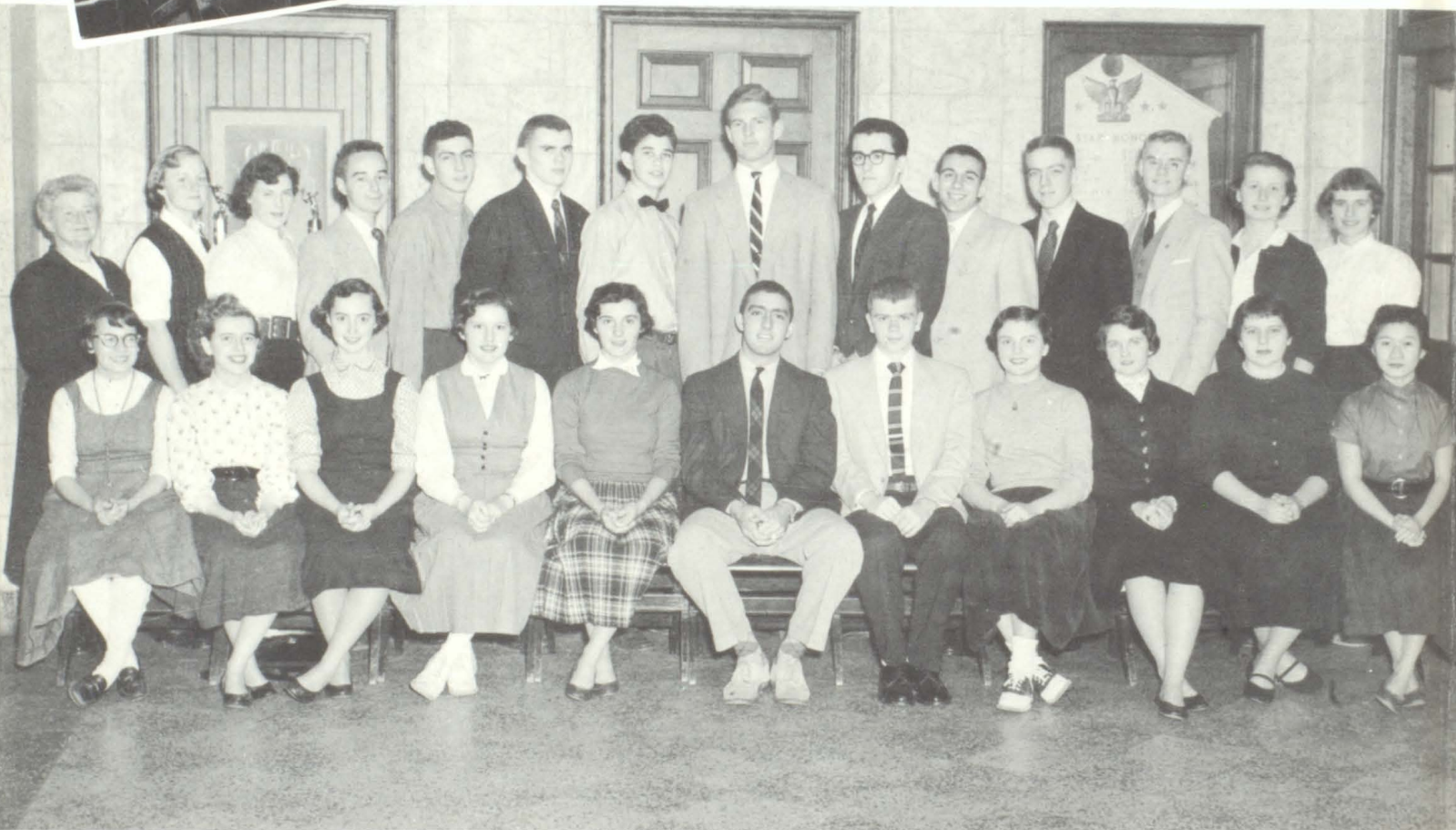


ORDER OF BASSICK SECRETARIES

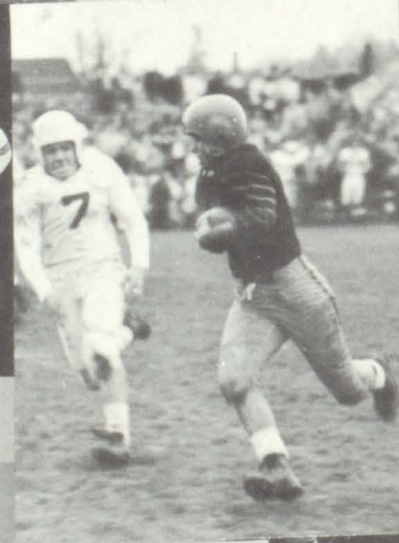

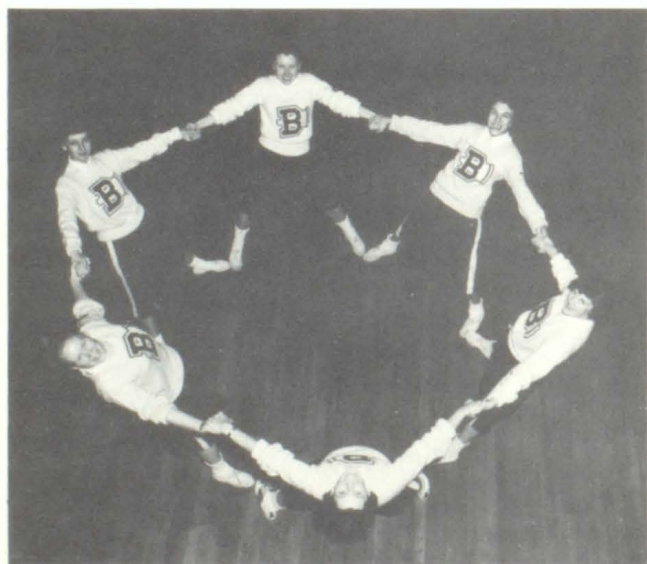

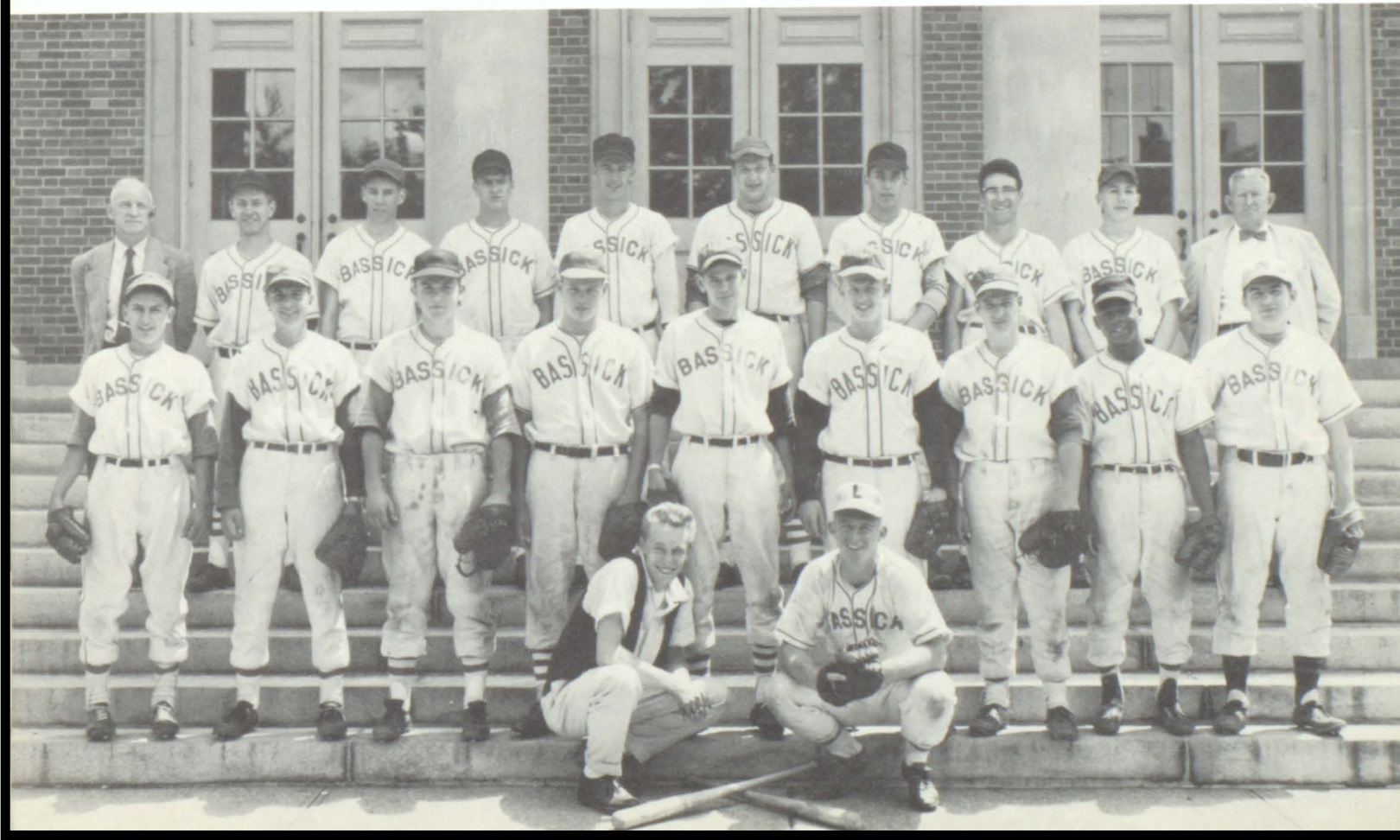
BASEBALL TEAM

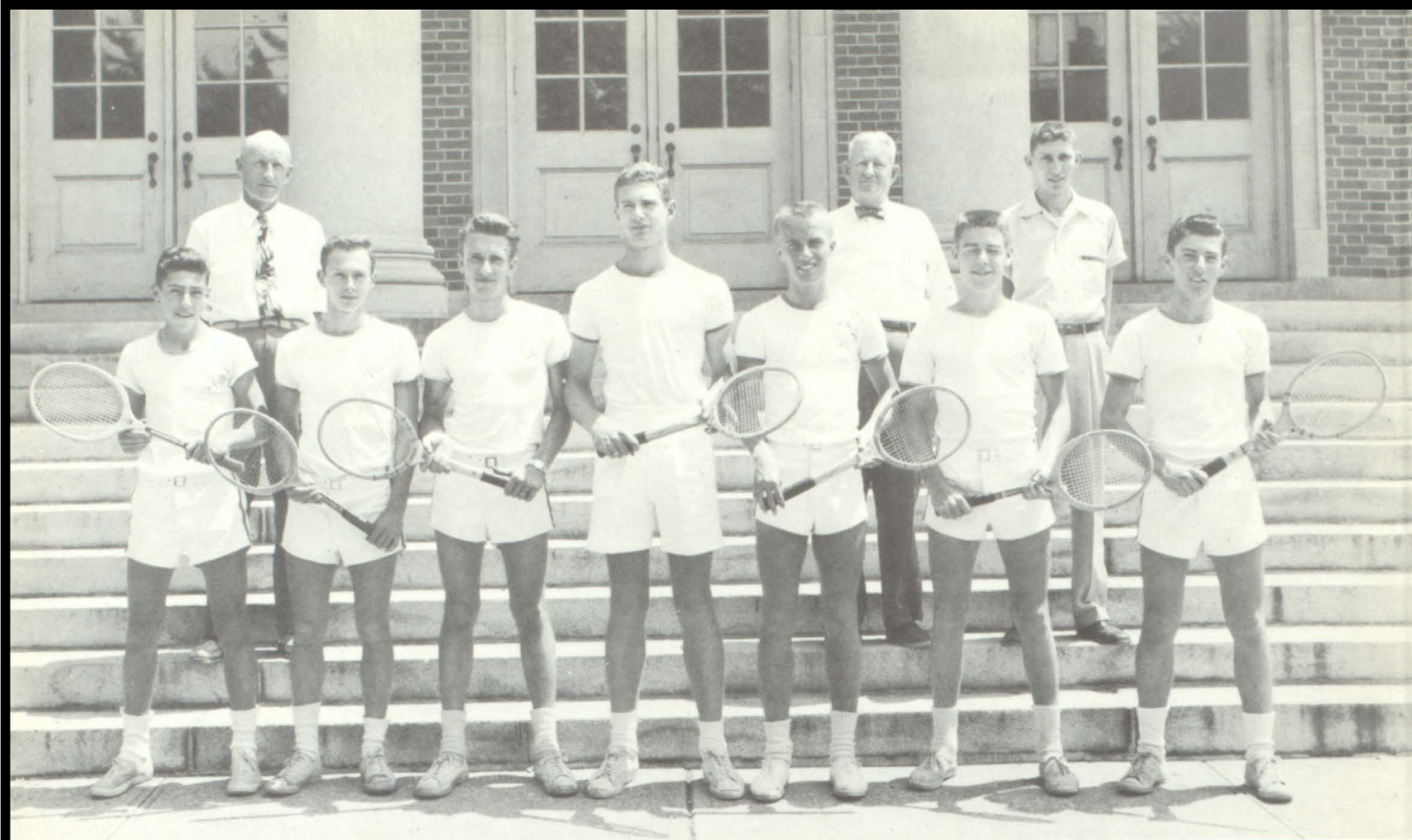
