
Dropping everything, they dashed to the airport and chartered a Jones Jet plane and flew to the U.S. in two hours, just in time to go to the reunion.





Under the guidance of Miss Barbara Fotta, advisor, the Class of 1961 looks forward to more wonderful years at Bassick.








FOOTBALL TEAM


Various athletic organizations, featuring both team and individual sports, attract most Bassick students, either as participants or just as enthusiastic supporters.


BASKETBALL TEAM


