## New Subjects Balance

In an attempt to provide a balanced educational program which will meet the needs, abilities, and interests of all Bassick students, the administration has added several new subjects to the traditional courses.

Developmental reading, special science, and Asian history are being offered to certain collegebound seniors. Developmental reading attempts, through the use of the accelerated reader (a gift last year from the Fathers' Club) to improve both the students' reading speed and comprehension rate. Special science covers those areas which are not included in the regular biology, physics, and chemistry courses. Asian history, a one-period-a-week lecture course taught by Miss Marie Cooney, attempts to give the students an
