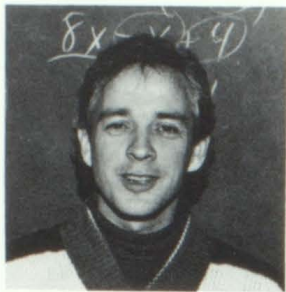
Mr. Buzzard loves art and enjoys working with teenagers. He gets great satisfaction from knowing he is doing a good job.

3. "Teachers are wise, yet some are otherwise."

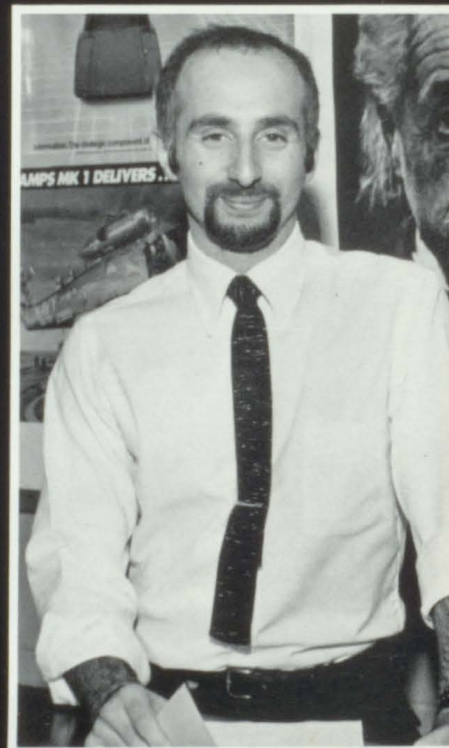
What it sums up to is not the time spent but the quality given. We can justify, that when it comes to education Bassick teachers give it with ZEST!
