
The 1994 season was a disappointing one for the Bassick Lions football team. The Lions, whose 2-7-1 record was their first losing record in three years, enjoyed wins over the Black Knights of Stamford (14-0), and the Cadets of St. Joseph's (28-14). The big cats were playing very well on the ground and averaged over 150 rushing yards per game. Standouts on offense this year were senior running back Somsay Saksene (co-captain), senior running back Che Miller, sophomore wide receiver Melvin King, and senior quarterback Keith Mims.

The Bassick defense, nicknamed "The Headhunters," averaged eight turn-overs per game. The defense had one shut-out and 8 interceptions and gave up an average of 200 yards per game. The defense, lead by senior linebacker Ian Penny (co-captain), senior cornerback Somsay Saksene, senior


defensive end Tremain Wilson, and senior safety Andrew Phillips, owned the ground, allowing only two opposing running backs to gain over 125 yards.

Although the record indicates that the lions lost 7 games, it doesn't show all the hard work and effort they consistently expended throughout the season in each of those 7 losses.
