# **Descriptive Summary**

*Abstract:* The records of the Bridgeport Scientific Society represent an overview of the activities of the first tenants of the Barnum Institute of Science and History, today housing the Barnum Museum. It contains administrative information in the form of society minutes, documentation of collection acquisitions, and extensive documentation of the lectures hosted by the group.

# **Biographical Information or Administrative History**

The building that now houses the Barnum Museum originally was constructed for the sake of the Bridgeport Scientific Society, Bridgeport Medical Society, and the Fairfield County Historical Society. It was completed in 1893, having been constructed by the firm of Longstaff and Hurd. (Longstaff and Hurd also constructed P.T. Barnum's last home *Marina*.) Both organizations existed before the building was built, with the Fairfield County Historical Society being founded in 1881 and the Bridgeport Scientific Society being founded in the year 1878.

The Scientific and Historical societies, along with the Bridgeport Medical Society, made use of the building until 1933. During that time they collected a number of items that survive in the collection of the current Barnum Museum. They, hosted lectures from a number of scientific and technological luminaries and provided a place for the public to be educated. Eventually, the societies collapsed, as membership dues and subscriptions were not enough to pay for upkeep. At that time they ceded ownership of the building and the collections to the City of Bridgeport.

# **Scope and Content Note**

The contents of the Records of the Bridgeport Scientific Society primarily offer an overview of the day-to-day function of the society. This is due to the heavy presence of meeting minutes and

correspondence, and the fact that there is much less information regarding the specimen collections or research sponsored by the society. However, the extensive amount of lecture programs offer insight into the educational outreach the society conducted and what members believed would capture public attention to bring in attendees to these events. This series, series VI, runs from 1881-1907 with very few gaps. It is complimented by the scrapbooks in series VIII which contain newspaper clippings that offer summaries of the events.

# **Arrangement Note**

The arrangement of the Records of the Bridgeport Scientific Society is primarily chronological, and broken into the following series: minutes and executive documents (series I), correspondence, (series II), financial documents (series III), curatorial documentation (series IV), general activity (series V), lectures and programs (series VI), record books (series VII), and scrapbooks (series VIII.) The record books and scrapbooks are oversized, and due to their delicate nature, cannot be housed in manuscript boxes with the rest of the collection.

## **Provenance**

Collection was likely transferred from the Bridgeport Scientific Society when it ceased to function in the 1930s. No deed of gift has been located.

## **Related Materials**

The Barnum Museum holds a small collection of documents similar to the material present in the Records of the Bridgeport Scientific Society. That collection, Records of the Barnum Institute of Science and History (BM-MSS 0001), contains additional documentation related to separate entities that were the Bridgeport Scientific Society and the Fairfield County Historical Society prior to their move into the Barnum building. Also present in that collection is more extensive documentation of the opening day exercises of the building itself, biographical information of the personnel in the building, and most importantly, a catalog of material housed on site.
