Abstract: Founded in 1919, Bridgeport Rotary has provided public service for 100 years. As a part of Rotary International, the club's mandate to provide public good and promote business among members is well documented in the collection. In addition to providing day-to-day administrative information from the club's history, a large portion of the records focus on the 1970s to 1990s. Viewed in conjunction with other like organizations from that time - such as the records of the United Way and the YWCA - these materials offer an insight into the societal problems of

Bridgeport during a time of sharp economic downtown in the city.

Administrative History

For a full and complete history of the Bridgeport Rotary club, please refer to *Bridgeport Rotary: A Century of Service...to Bridgeport and the World, 1919-2019[...]* written by Christopher Gallo. The Bridgeport History Center retains a copy, and this administrative history relies extensively on Gallo's work.

Rotary is an international organization made up of local community clubs whose emphasis is on public service within the community and internationally. It was the brain child of Paul Harris, who began the organization in Chicago, 1905. He was inspired to collect local business owners together, trade ideas, and build a support network to help improve Chicago. The name Rotary came from the fact that meeting places were in a rotation.

Bridgeport's club was founded in 1919, consisting of 28 male members and meeting at the Stratfield Hotel. The group would meet for lunch, talk business and the community, and then enjoy a lecture on a topic that might range from humanities to sciences to anything in between. The discussion of the community lead to community service projects, and a solid network of both helping hands and financial assistance in order to make projects possible. Until 1987, Rotary was a male-only organization.

The list of Bridgeport Rotary's public service projects is extensive. One of their first was the creation of Camp Pomperaug, a camp for children, in 1923 - extremely early on in Rotary's history. Providing service to Bridgeport's children is a particular hallmark of Bridgeport Rotary's history, as their works range from large scale projects such as that camp to building playgrounds, providing scholarships, and helping to fund all other manner of supportive services both focused on academic achievement and providing after school activities to engage Bridgeport's youth.

That academic emphasis has manifested in other ways too. Bridgeport Rotary was an early sponsor of the Junior College of Connecticut, which in 1947 became the University of Bridgeport.

In the 1970s, the Bridgeport Rotary Club began one of it's most ambitious projects, and one that strived to meet one of Bridgeport's greatest needs. It began the construction of housing for senior citizens and low income households, all under the corporate name of Bridgeport Rotary Housing Corporation. One building expanded into two, and while these buildings have required updates over the years, they continue to stand and are used to provide housing to those who need it most.

These are only highlights of Bridgeport Rotary's many, *many* charitable works over it's illustrious century. All of the works strive to reflect Rotary International's values of promotion of business among members, good fellowship, community service, and community pride.

Scope and Content note:

The records of the Rotary Club of Bridgeport Connecticut documents the activities of the club from roughly its founding up into 2005, which was when the last material was donated to the Bridgeport History Center. Much of the material relates to administrative matters of the club, including minutes from various committees, programs, and behind-the-scenes work in order to maintain the club's dedication to service.

As the bulk of the material covers the 1970s to the 1990s, the collection is of particular interest to those looking to examine Bridgeport during its economic downturn during that time frame.

In 2021, additional material from a later donation was found in the Bridgeport History Center's collections. Mostly financial in nature, the material picks up from where the last donation of the 1990s left off. The contents did not have significant overlap that required inferfiling - instead, additional series were created. These materials primarily focus on the organization's finances from the 1990s into 2005. See arrangement note for further details.

Arrangement note:

The arrangement of the collection is slightly odd, as it seems that a portion of the collection was kept in original order, with the rest being lightly processed. As such, series I, called office files represents the original order of material, likely removed from a file cabinet. Series II, subject files, is an alphabetical file listing of material, as processed by a former archivist here at the Bridgeport History Center. Series III consists of member rosters and it shares a box with series IV. The fifth series is membership index cards/applications, followed by a clippings series (VI). Series VII consists of minimally processed photographs in a half manuscript box.

In 2021, a later donation of material was found in collections. These documents make up series VII through XII, as there was very little overlap of material between the initial donation and this accrual, which seems to have come in 2007.

Series VII, finances, is divided into two subseries: banking and subject files. The banking information represents bank statements, bills paid, and general financial information. The subject files contain financial information regarding specific topics. Newsletters consist of the district's

newsletter up until the time of donation, as do directories. Programs are minimally processed, arranged alphabetically by programs that were already set aside in folders upon donation, and then a general set of program files. Videos are arranged chronologically, and can be viewed in the Bridgeport History Center. The final series consists of small objects and ephemera, including banners and tote bags.

Some subject files and membership directories have been listed in the appropriate series elsewhere. Their status from 2007 donation is clear by the later box number they have been assigned.
