Much has been written about the history of the American Civil War (1861-1865) and its legacy in American history. The conflict over the legality of slavery in the United States ended countless lives and impacted the survivors.

It is also one of the first major wars to be documented through photographs, and thus it has been a constant source of fascination, creating ephemeral material since the conflict concluded.
