and a financial ledger.

Administrative History

Bridgeport Centennial Inc. began as a plan and scope committee of approximately sixty members in December of 1935. This committee, under the chairmanship of former mayor Edward T. Buckingham and drew upon the basic plans for the upcoming celebration, for in 193 Bridgeport was to celebrate her 100th year. The Plan and Scope Committee scheduled tentative events and formulated a rough budget.

In early January on an executive committee was selected by Mayor Jasper McLevy in conference with a special sub-committee. The first meeting of this executive committee was held on January 14, 1936. At this meeting the committee voted to adopt all suggestions of the Plan and Scope Committee and also decided to become incorporated as Bridgeport Centennial, Inc. Mayor McLevy was selected as honorary chairman and former mayor Buckingham would serve as acting chairman. Senator John M. Taft was elected vice-chairman, Francis J. Hill of the Chamber of Commerce was elected secretary and City Comptroller Perry J. Rodman was voted treasurer. W.B. Aurandt was chosen to be the managing director of the corporation. Other members were: Rabbi Albert L. Martin, the Reverend Dr. Willian Horace Day, W. Gerald Bryant, George Wellington, Bernard J. lee, Edward J. Pease, Mrs. Alvin c. Bruel, Cornelius J. Donnelly, Judge Frederick A. Bartlett, and John J. O'Neill.

The executive committee met throughout the celebration, which lasted from January, Bridgeport Night at the United Church Forum, until October 3, the date on which Isaac Sherman Jr. took office as the city's first mayor in 1836.

Some important events of the Centennial Celebration were: the Centennial Exposition held at the Remington Buildings on Helen Street in May; Charter Day, June 4, which was the official opening of the Celebration and celebrated the original grant of the city's charger; the re-opening of the Barnum Museum on June 16; the Centennial Historical Pageant, which took place on July 18 and 19 and depicted the history of Bridgeport; Old Home Week which was August 1-8 and welcomed back past Bridgeporters; an immense Labor Day parade on September 7 which featured many floats, bands, etc.; finally the Official Closing of the Centennial, on October 3rd, where the new monument was unveiled and historical events were dramatized.

Another important accomplishment of the organization was the issue of a special coin to commemorate the Centennial. This coin, a 50 cent piece, featured P.T. Barnum on one side and eagle on the other. There were between 15,000-25,000 coins issued and they were sold for \$2 each. A special postal cachet was also printed and sold.

One of the organization's most important achievements was the publishing of a book, *The Story of Bridgeport*. The book was researched and written by Mrs. Elsie Nichols Dannenberg and tells Bridgeport's history from its earliest origins up to the Centennial. A program of the centennial was printed in the back of the book.

On October 9, 1936, Bridgeport Centennial, Inc. closed its books. Though sales of coins and books continued, the company's activities, in effect, ended. The company was left with a surplus. Of the cash, \$3000 was given to the library in December of 1937, and the remainder, along with the left over coins, was given to the Community Chest. In addition, 13,000 copies of *The Story of Bridgeport* were donated to the library. On April 26, 1938, Bridgeport Centennial, Inc., was officially dissolved.

Scope and Content Note

The records of Bridgeport Centennial, Inc. cover a period extending from December 193 until October 1936. The majority of the material is concentrated between June and October of 1936.

There are length files on all facets of advertising and publicity, as well as a detailed file on the publishing and merchandising the book *The Story of Bridgeport*. There are also programs and publications from many of the events which took place during the celebration.

Along with the office files are six scrapbooks of newspaper clippings dealing with the city's centennial. There is also a financial leger and an itemized list of all objects displayed at the Centennial Exposition.

Arrangement Note

Due to fragile nature, material has primarily been left together as it was inventoried. A large spiral bound notebook has been moved to its own folder.
