# **Biographical History**

Founder of major Bridgeport institutions such as Harborfest, Joseph Caesar Cardozo was born in Port Chester, New York, on May 19, 1953. He graduated high school from Notre Dame in Fairfield, Connecticut. Cardozo went on to receive a BA in special education and communications from Western Michigan University in 1977 and then a Masters in educational administration from Wayne State University in 1980. Between these years Joseph Caesar Cardozo also worked as a special education teacher in Michigan.

He returned to Connecticut in 1980, occupying a position in the Connecticut Department of Children and Youth Services until 1985. Cardozo was instrumental in organizing the Ernestina Committee of Cape Verdeans United into the Connecticut Friends of Ernestina/Morrissey Inc. This enabled the creation of the Ocean Classroom, a maritime education program for Bridgeport youth that also lead to the creation of the Bridgeport Vocational Center for Aquaculture.

The Ernestina is a storied schooner that in the mid-20th century became a part of trade that crossed to Cape Verde. As Bridgeport has strong connections to Cape Verde, the ship is of particular note for the local community. Cardozo helped with preserving the ship itself, which was donated to the state of Massachusetts.

In addition to organizing the Ocean Classroom and helping to restore the Ernestina, Cardozo was a key part of founding Bridgeport's Harborfest, a citywide festival that celebrates Bridgeport's maritime heritage, especially in the Black Rock section of the city.

A gifted educator, Joseph was able to develop curricula for middle schoolers in not only English, but Kreyol, Haitian and Cape Verdean Creole, Spanish, and Vietnamese, among others.

Cardozo was an involved educator and active citizen, serving in Bridgeport politics. He was the elected representative for the 133<sup>rd</sup> district in Bridgeport from 1982 to 1984, a part of the

Connecticut State Advisory Harbor Management and Waterways Commission, and Board of Contract Appliance for the City of Bridgeport.

He moved to New Bedford, Massachusetts in 1988 where he worked as the Director of Programs and Development for the Schooner Ernestina organization. He was present when the schooner was designated a National Historic Landmark, and remained at the post until 1992 when he moved to Boston. From 1992 until his death in 1994, Cardozo worked as the Director of Education for the Multicultural Aids Coalition.

Cardozo died on July 9, 1994 with a large number of awards and honors in his name, including the 1987 Invited Educational Guest of the Republic of Cape Verde.

### **Scope and Content note:**

The collection was found in the Bridgeport History Center in a binder, with material arranged in a particular way but the source was unclear. Mostly containing newspaper clippings, along with promotional material for the Schooner Ernestine, the Ocean Classroom, and Harborfest. The collection shows Cardozo's passions and helps document their impact on the City of Bridgeport. The amount of photocopied newspapers likewise shows how Cardozo's hard work was received at the time, as well as the sheer volume of work he did for the community.
