Abstract: The Model Cities Program was a nationwide initiative begun by the Lyndon B. Johnson administration and lasted from 1966 to 1974. A part of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, participating cities sought to approach urban redevelopment and renewal from a different angle, especially as they began to become popular, well known terms. This collection contains printed material and reports related to Bridgeport's implementation of the Model Cities program, as well as related social service programs that followed in its wake.

The Model Cities Program was a nationwide initiative begun by the Lyndon B. Johnson administration and lasted from 1966 to 1974. A part of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, participating cities sought to approach urban redevelopment and renewal from a different angle, especially as they began to become popular, well known terms. A key part of the Model Cities Program was to rehabilitate social service programs and emphasize citizen participation. The success of the program's effectiveness varied depending on location.

Bridgeport's success has been considered mixed, although there were a number of similar organizations that followed in the wake of Model Cities. This includes the Urban Coalition as well as the Higher Education Center for Urban Studies (HECUS). Please see those collections for further information.

As Model Cities was meant to provide support to local social service programs, other organizations and works are represented in this collection, with an emphasis on community health and housing. See scope and content note for more information.

Scope and Content note:

The collection contains printed material and reports related to Bridgeport's implementation of the Model Cities program, as well as related social service programs that followed in its wake addressing needs such as community health, employment, and housing. These reports help to demonstrate the needs of Bridgeport in the 1970s and into the 1980s, as well as how various programs tried to respond.
