Abstract: During the second World War, the United States government issued war bonds to help fund war efforts. The material in the collection contains both the organizational information for the

sale of war bonds, as well as how the bonds were promoted locally within Bridgeport.

Biographical History:

War bonds are a means for governments to raise funding to support a war effort that ordinary defense spending would not otherwise cover. Citizens purchase war bonds to supply the funding needed, and then can cash in those bonds after they have matured for a number of years, increasing the investment. Bonds of this nature often rely on patriotic propaganda to increase the likelihood of purchase, and this was especially true during World War II.

In the United States of America, the second World War saw a large roll out of bonds. They could be purchased as ten cent saving stamps or as larger Series E bonds, which accounted for economic differences. Bond drives and rallies were often themed or had celebrities present in order to increase sales. There were also loan drives (eight in total.)

Scope and Content note:

The material in the collection contains both the organizational information for the sale of war bonds, as well as how the bonds were promoted locally within Bridgeport. This includes information about special campaigns, the second through eight loan drives, and the Women's Division that helped with sales.

Arrangement Note:

Series I, Administration, includes office payroll, correspondence, and memos relating to sales. Series II contains the various ways that bonds were promoted within Bridgeport, including special bond drives. Series III contains information regarding the Women's Division, including those involved and a newsletter, as well as instructional information. Series IV contains material related to specific loan drives on a local, state, and national level.
