# **Descriptive Summary**

**Abstract** During World War I, Bridgeport's many industries helped supply the war effort, even before the United States entered the war in 1917. Residents also participated in events such as war bond drives and created organizations to support servicemembers from the city. This artificial collection represents the latter, and includes some of the material of the Minute Women, along with material relating to the Red Cross and other organizations, as well as newspaper clippings.

### **Biographical History:**

During World War I, Bridgeport's many industries helped supply the war effort. This included Remington Arms and Bridgeport Brass, along with smaller companies like Nielson Machine Tool Company. Residents of Bridgeport also served in the war.

This artificial collection of World War I related material found in the collections of the Bridgeport History Center represents a small slice of Bridgeport's role in the war; it focuses on propaganda created by the United States government and the State of Connecticut to encourage support for the war and the actions of Bridgeport residents in doing the same. Please note that this is not an extensive or definitive collection.

#### **Scope and Content note:**

The contents of the material are primarily propaganda created by the United States, the State of Connecticut, or local organizations related to increasing patriotism and encouraging support for America's war effort. There is some German language material reflecting German perspective. Of particular note are the minutes of the Minute Women, a women's support and organizing group for families and servicemembers overseas.
