Abstract: Peter Arnell, a Bridgeport native, took up radio performance and production when he attended the University of Michigan, graduating in 1941. After working as a disc jockey for several stations across the U.S., he developed a number of popular, nationally-broadcasted television game shows of the 1950s, including the original version of *Wheel of Fortune*. His papers include promotional materials seeking shows' support from consumer-goods companies, as well as scripts, photos of participants, entertainment-industry journals, and newspaper clippings.

Biographical History:

Peter Arnell – originally Antonelli – was born in Bridgeport in 1918. An ardent participant in theater and radio activities at the University of Michigan, he earned a degree in 1941 and later in the decade began working for radio stations in Beckley, West Virginia; Paterson, New Jersey; Chicago; Detroit; New York City; and Philadelphia. By the start of the 1950s, his focus shifted to television shows based in Hollywood. Over the next ten years, he produced the game-shows *I'll Buy That*, *Talent Scouts*, *Take a Good Look*, and *Wheel of Fortune*, among others. Many were projects of IMPA, a New York City TV-production company co-owned by Arnell with Irving Mansfield, who produced several shows for CBS over the 1940s and 1950s. Arnell was a member of the Screen Actors Guild and American Federation of Television and Radio Artists unions. He died in Branford, Connecticut in 1993.

Scope and Content Note:

Arnell's papers begin with his high-school and college diplomas and then document his professional life as a radio entertainer and television producer between 1941 and 1960. Scripts of a number of his game shows, all broadcast by CBS, are joined by photos of participants, media clips, and promotional brochures outlining the shows' popularity and aiming to secure corporate funding to support new seasons. A small set of additional materials includes his list of ambitions declared after graduating college, a publicity photo, and business cards advertising his performance skills and, later, his status as a vice-president for IMPA.

Arrangement note: The collection takes up one box. It consists of three series: education, consisting of two diplomas; a larger set of papers focused on the advertising and substance of Arnell's radio and television shows; and a group of additional materials related to his career.
