Biographical History:

Rev. Nathaniel Hewit was born in New London, Conn., graduated from Yale College and studied theology at Andover. He was minister at the Presbyterian Church in Plattsburg, NY, 1815-1817; the Congregational Church in Fairfield, CT, 1818-1827; the 2nd Congregational Church in Bridgeport, CT 1830-1853; and the Presbyterian Church in Bridgeport, CT which he and 78 members organized in 1853.

He lectured at home and abroad for the American Temperance Society, 1827-1930.

He was married to Rebecca Hillhouse of New Haven who died January 4, 1831; Miss Susan Eliot of Fairfield who died May 1, 1857, His children by his first marriage were Henry S. Hewit, M.D., Army Surgeon; Rev. Augustus F. Hewit, Paulist Father; and Sara, widow of William S. Bowen, M.D.

Scope and Content note:

The letters to Rebecca Hillhouse are personal. Rev. Nathaniel Hewit's papers deal with his pastor ships, Temperance, Bible societies, and a few legal papers. Some of the papers are photocopies and many received by the library were previously backed with rice paper.
