Biographical History:

Born in Cookville, Tennessee in 1898, Clara Truman was a graduate of the University of Oklahoma. A member of the American Association of University Women, she was an active member of various civic and non-profit groups in the city of Bridgeport. This included the American Red Cross and the YMCA Women's Auxiliary League. She died on December 26, 1983.

Her husband was Lloyd Truman. Sadly, Truman's obituary does not provide any further details about her life.

Scope and Content note:

Material primarily consists of invitations to events by various charitable or other non-profit organizations from the 1940s to the 1970s. This includes organizations like the American Red Cross, Easter Seals, Jewish community organizations, American Association for the United Nations, and more local Bridgeport and Fairfield County events.

Also included is some correspondence to Truman, often thank you notes for her service, and clippings about recent activities she was involved in.
