Abstract. Lewis Corbit Junior, known as Lew, helped run the Corbit Studio from the passing of his father in 1952 until his death in 1986. Known as a treasure trove of Bridgeport's history thanks to the studio's presence in Bridgeport since 1906, Lew's personal papers reflect his family life and activities outside of the photo studio. This included correspondence to his parents during World War II, material related to his wife Ione's teaching career in Bridgeport, his time as a scout master for the Boy Scouts, and more. There is minimal material related to Corbit Studios in this collection.

Biographical History:

Lewis Henry Corbit Jr. (Lew) was born in Bridgeport on October 14, 1914. The son of Lewis Corbit Sr. and his wife Hazel Cummings, Lew was born into a family of photographers. He took over the family business with his brother Lawson following Lewis Sr.'s death in 1952.

Corbit's Studio began in 1906, and was housed at 2 Elm Street until closing in 2002. A treasure trove of Bridgeport's history, they were responsible for photographing major Bridgeport events, offered portrait photography, and did additional work on the side.

Lew himself was also a great repository of Bridgeport history, and was well known in Bridgeport for this. He served in the Army in World War II, and met his wife Ione in that period. A Nashville, Tennessee native, Ione and Lew wed in 1943. They had a son, Lewis Sanders. Ione worked as a teacher in Bridgeport for thirty years, with most of her time spent at the Maplewood School. In addition to army service and running the photography studio, Lew acted as a scout master Boy Scouts of America troop #71 based in Stratford. He led the group for 25 years.

Lewis Corbit Jr. died on June 20, 1986. His wife Ione passed away on January 4, 1989.

Scope and Content note:

It should be emphasized from the beginning that the Papers of Lew Corbit Jr. contain very little information regarding Corbit Studio, the photography studio founded by Corbit's father. Instead, these are personal papers that reflect life outside of the photography studio and provide insight

into Lew Corbit Jr. himself. This includes correspondence to his parents during World War II, material related to his wife Ione and her career as an educator in Bridgeport, and their son Lewis Sanders who features in photographs and correspondence. An active scout master for the Boy Scouts of America, Lew Corbit Jr.'s leadership of troop #71 out of neighboring Stratford is heavily featured. He led the group for 25 years.

Some material relates to Corbit's parents - including their estate - but most of it is visible in the personal photographs that compromise series III. Some earlier material from the 19th Century is included in the collection, but it is scant.

Arrangement note:

The collection is divided into four series. The first, personal papers and correspondence, contains letters, personal effects, and similar documents relating to Lew himself, his wife Ione, and their son. They are placed in order of relation to Lew Corbit Jr. Series II is a subject file that focuses on various personal commitments in Corbit Jr.'s life including his time as a scout master for the Boy Scouts of America, professional commitments, and some earlier family correspondence. They are arranged alphabetically.

Photographs compromise series III. Save a small folder of material taken by Corbit Studios, these are non-professional photographs. Rather, they are typical family photographs featuring various relatives, trips, and so on. They are arranged by family relations first, and then chronologically when possible. Photograph albums and negatives are also included.

Series IV features a small smattering of physical objects including various patches from the Boy Scouts of America.
