**Abstract:** The International Institute – known variously as the International Institute of Greater Bridgeport, the Nationalities Service Center of Greater Bridgeport, the International Institute of Connecticut, and now the Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants – was founded in 1918. Originally a part of Bridgeport's YWCA, the International Institute was originally created to provide social support and encourage the Americanization of young female immigrants and first-generation girls. Over time, the mission has expanded to support immigrants as well as refugees from war torn regions of the world, help individuals gain American citizenship, offer family resources, provide information, assist with family reunions, and much more. The material within the collection focuses primarily on the Institute from the late 1940s to the 1970s, documenting not only the transition of services provided, but the immigrants that America and specifically Bridgeport welcomed. Please note that this collection has restrictions due to sensitive information within.

## **Administrative History**:

The International Institute – known variously as the International Institute of Greater Bridgeport, the Nationalities Service Center of Greater Bridgeport, the International Institute of Connecticut, and now the Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants – was founded in 1918. A part of the Bridgeport's Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA), it was a part of the national YWCA's response to the continuing need to provide services for new immigrants to America, especially women. In the case of Bridgeport's International Institute branch, this meant the International Institute was originally a part of the local branch's War Council Work group. At the time, Bridgeport's various industries were manufacturing material for the first World War, and hiring incoming immigrants kept production numbers up.

Following the end of the war, the International Institute came under the purview of the YWCA's Department of Immigration and Foreign Communities. It remained a part of the YWCA's services until 1934, when it became its own independent agency.

International Institute staff were, from the beginning, social workers who spoke a variety of

languages and were expected to help clients work through immigration process and law. Early services meant not only navigating the legal process of naturalization, but help with housing, English classes, employment opportunities, and generally helping immigrants from southern and Eastern Europe integrate into American life. The original emphasis on young women – the primary constituents of the YWCA – expanded, as did the services provided. By the 1940s, additional services included family counseling in response to conflict between immigrant parents and first-generation American children, family reunification, and additional social problems. The goal was successful transition into American life, focused on the greater Bridgeport area, or "Americanization."

The nationalities that were served by the YWCA reflect the immigration patterns of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Up into the 1950s, many of those who took advantage of the service were Italian, Hungarian, Polish, Ukrainian, and other eastern Europe ethnicities. It is not until the late 1960s that the records reflect more southeast Asian and South American countries coming to America. This reflects the changing world, but also American understanding of ethnic groups and how they fit into American society. The 1970s saw this rhetoric disappear from the language used by the Institute, pointing to changes in understanding the concept of Americanization and the impact it had and still has on immigrants, especially refugees.

One of the signature programs of the Institute was the International Folk Festival. Both it and its predecessor, the Festival of Nations, placed emphasis on traditions from other countries. This meant traditional costumes, dances, and food, along with pageants and a Queen for each festival. Often working in collaboration with the Barnum Festival, the International Folk Festival helped fundraise for the International Institute as well. Additional fund raisers included annual dinners, galas, rummage sales, and workshops.

Financial support also came from the Community Chest group, later a part of the United Fund. This let the International Institute continue to provide services with a steady income in order to pay for staff, their services, and other organization needs.

Smaller groups that fell under the auspices of the International Institute helped to support its mission as well. The Cosmopolitan Club was often made of Bridgeport residents who acted as the fundraising arm of the organization, and during and after the second World War, the Godparents of Italian War Orphans group formed. Comprised mostly of Italians and Italian-Americans, they helped to fundraise and both send money and goods to Italian orphanages in the midst and the aftermath of the second World War. They also helped facilitate some adoptions, and collaborated with other Italian and Italian American organizations to provide further support.

In 2017, the group became the Connecticut Institute for Refugees and Immigrants. Their services still include immigration legal service, translation services, and help for refugees, but now also include support for survivors of human rights abuses including war and human trafficking, and greater focus and help on economic support and independence.

#### **Scope and Content:**

The Records of the International Institute primarily represent immigration trends in the early to mid-20<sup>th</sup> century, with less material related to the 1970s onward. Meeting minutes reflect the priorities and actions of the organization at the highest administrative levels, and the extensive financial records provide insight into the daily ins and outs of operation, mostly focused on the 1940s to early 1970s. The Office of the Executive Director subject files round out the key issues

that were focused on.

Material related to immigration and immigration trends comes primarily in the form of studies and reports about the greater Bridgeport area and the United States. These studies are supplemented by circulars and information pamphlets aimed at both new arrivals to the United States, but also publications such as *Interpreter Releases*, which were aimed at social workers and service providers to keep them up to date. Legal information and secondary works likewise reflect the pertinent changes to laws and legalities on the immigrant experience in America.

While there are materials related to cases in and around Bridgeport, they come primarily in the forms of statistics. They paint a picture of the nationalities that the International Institute was helping at the time, the services needed, and success rates, but do not delve into the private lives of individual cases. This is by design (see *immediate source of acquisition*).

There is extensive material related to the Institute's signature International Folk Festival, as well as records related to the Cosmopolitan Club and the work of the Godparents of Italian War Orphans. A more general subject file, along with clippings and scrapbooks, help to emphasize topics of interest and how the International Institute was viewed by Bridgeport and eastern Fairfield County.

While this collection focuses on the experience of immigrants, it also grapples with questions of ethnicity, and when an immigrant group is truly incorporated into the definition of "American." The vast majority of the groups represented in the collection (Italian, Hungarian, Polish, Ukrainian) were viewed as "other" into the 1960s. They were not white Anglo-Saxon Protestants, and thus subject to types of discrimination that at the time of writing (2022), would be understood as bordering on racism. There is in fact very little on race in the collection until the 1970s, when refugees to American soil began to include southeast Asians, especially residents of Vietnam. This is not to say that there are not individuals of color in the collection prior to that era, but the proportions are different, and worth considering when examining the material and framing it within the greater historic record of 20th Century American immigration.

## **Arrangement:**

There was no discernable original order in the boxes, nor was there an extensive inventory that noted distinct series. While some clear and obvious groupings became apparent in processing, there is no means of telling which series were truly kept by International Institute staff in a specific order. As such, all series are artificial.

Series I contains board minutes in chronological order.

Series II, files of the executive director, contain two subseries: general subject files and the papers of Myra Oliver. Over the years, a number of directors of the International Institute used the same files (likely using the same desk and cabinets and building on that of their predecessors), making it impossible to parse out individual directors works without disrupting original order. The exception to this were the files of Myra Oliver, which were placed in a different box and thus easier to distinguish. All material is in alphabetically order by folder title.

Series III, Cases and case work, primarily features information about services provided to immigrants in Bridgeport in general, rather than specific details of cases. They split into two subseries - statistics and cases - and both subseries arranged chronologically. As many folders in this series contain information about living individuals, researchers must contact Bridgeport

History Center staff before coming in to review the material. Staff will check to ensure that no personal identifying data is present.

Series IV contains reports and studies. Material related to Bridgeport has been placed first, followed by Connecticut, and then more general reports and studies.

Series V contains material related to immigration information and services, and is divided into four subseries. The first contains US laws and congressional reports, and the second US government forms and information. Both are arranged chronologically and represent reference material and key information used by International Institute staff in order to provide accurate information to clients. Subseries 3 contains directories and guides meant to provide further support for those taking advantage of the International Institute, and subseries four represents further information and reference found in the collection.

Circulars and information make up series VI, and compliment the material found in series IV. A number of organizations put out supplementary materials, additional information reports, and other needed and useful material for those working with immigrants in order to stay up to date and to best advocate for the needs of those individuals. Material is arranged alphabetically by title.

Series VII, Finances, contains the following subseries: budgets, financial statements, salary, and subject files. All are arranged chronologically, excluding the subject files which are arranged alphabetically. The salary subseries is restricted unless a direct relation to an individual can be proven.

Festivals and events are contained in series VIII, with the International Folk Festival placed first in subseries 1. Beginning in the late 1950s and going strong into the 1970s, it was a signature event of the organization that highlighted Bridgeport's ethnic communities. It is followed by subseries 2, other events, which contain details related to balls, card parties, and other smaller events.

Series IX features the records of the Cosmopolitan Club, a fundraising arm of the organization. Series X relates to the Godparents of Italian War Orphans group. Bridgeport had a large Italian and Italian American community during the Second World War, and both during and after the events, there was a strong desire to provide care and support for orphaned Italian children. Information about the administrative structure of the group is placed first (minutes, membership, and so on), followed by general correspondence, then contact with orphanages in Italy and adoption information. Scant subject files round out the series. The adoption material is restricted at this time, as BHC needs to conduct further research into international adoption information related to this time period.

Series XI contains subject files arranged in alphabetical order. It is followed by series XII, scrapbooks and series XIII which contains chronologically arranged clippings.

## Administrative information:

Provenance: Gift of the International Institute. Extensive correspondence with Institute executor director Myra Oliver at the time of the donation shows a very careful selection and appraisal process conducted by archivist David Palmquist. A number of records were not taken in by the Bridgeport History Center at the time, primarily individual case files. This decision was made out of concerns for privacy and after discussion with other archivists including Randall Jimmerson during his tenure at the University of Connecticut and other archives with similar collections.

Restrictions: A number of files in this collection are restricted and are marked on the finding aid accordingly. Material related to salary and retirement is closed entirely without proving a direct relation to the individual, and case file material is to be reviewed by the archivist to ensure that no sensitive or personally identifying information (visa numbers, passport information, social security etc.) are on the documents. Those seeking to access the collection **must** contact the Bridgeport History Center with at least 24 hours notice to ensure adequate time for the archivists to review files for this type of information.
