# **Descriptive Summary**

**Abstract**. Originally called the College Club when it was founded in 1916, the American Association of University Women's Bridgeport chapter began with the goal to "promote literature and instill in high school girls the deeper significance of college life." Since then the chapter has gone on to support local education through scholarships, committee work, support of adult education, and providing community support, all while retaining the local character of the chapter. The collection focuses primarily on the group's early days into the 1970s and addresses the changing nature of education in an urban setting.

## **Biographical History:**

Originally called the College Club when it was founded in 1916, the American Association of University Women's Bridgeport chapter began with the goal to "promote literature and instill in high school girls the deeper significance of college life." The original founders, Sannie Bassett, Mollie Bassett Calvin, Harriet Bassett, Bertha Watson, Marion Green, Evelyn Davis, and Susan Matthews, were all college graduates in an era where it was not expected for most women to go on to higher education.

The College Club quickly grew to include 42 members, and they networked to help other college age women in the area and to advocate for better education overall. They began to award scholarships in 1919 - something the chapter still does today - and also worked to provide living spaces for members as needed. Their club house was purchased in 1927, and stood at 199 Cortland Street until it was sold to make way for Interstate 95. The club house also held teas and games of bridge, as well as hosted lectures on education, finance, and other interests for women,

In 1931, the College Club changed its name to the American Association of University Women, Bridgeport Chapter. This did not change its overall goal of promoting education for women - it simply offered more resources to do so while retaining a local character and focus.

This focus sharpened in the 1960s and 1970s, with a greater concentration on local education and support for Bridgeport public schools. The chapter worked with Youth Opportunities Unlimited/Youth Opportunities Unlimited Revised Services in the late 1960s and was a partner in

helping it transform into the School Volunteers Association (SVA), until that organization could operate independently. There was a greater focus on adult education as well into the 1980s, with Project Re-entry - a program meant to get adults back into education through college, vocational schools, adult education, and distance learning through Charter Oak College. The AAUW also hosted smaller courses on personal finance, retirement, and money management in response to greater economic independence for women through the right to open a bank account and the 1974 Equal Credit Opportunity Act.

The American Association of University Women's Bridgeport Chapter also donated its piano to the Bridgeport Public Library in 1971 to celebrate the opening of the Fine Arts Department formerly located in the Burroughs-Saden building. The group remains highly active, and still focuses on education in the area and awarding scholarships.

# **Scope and Content note:**

This collection is primarily comprised of subject files that shed light onto the interests of the organization from the 1910s into the 1970s. The presence of board minutes and executive board minutes within the subject files series helps to provide context for the rest of the subject files, and the scrapbooks offer a look at the public perception of the organization.

Series II, which features the working files from community projects in the late 1960s into the 1970s, demonstrates the commitment the organization displayed to improving Bridgeport during the era of urban renewal. The membership forms in series IV that date from the same era compliment these documents.

## **Arrangement note:**

The collection is arranged into four series. Series I contains subject files, arranged alphabetically. Series II, Committees and projects, contains the working papers and documents generated by initiatives the group participated in. They are arranged alphabetically by project names. Donor imposed restricted membership forms are placed in series III and arranged chronologically, and scrapbooks are arranged chronologically in series IV.

Subject files are split between two groups of boxes, due to the 1996.12 accession being found elsewhere in the stacks after the rest of the collection was processed. They are integrated in the subject file listing on the finding aid.
