

Maps at the Bridgeport History Center



The map collection at the Bridgeport History Center primarily focuses on documenting the changes made to Bridgeport, Connecticut. In addition, it contains regional maps of surrounding Fairfield County, and some maps of the wider New England area, as well as the United States.

By and large, the map collection is arranged by region depicted (Bridgeport, Fairfield County, etc.) and then by any apparent themes such as industries, zoning and planning, and similar. **However** due to the size of maps and storage space, this is not always possible, and those issues are reflected in the listings below. Likewise, some maps have restricted access due to fragility.
