### Highlights

October has been a very busy month here at Newfield. Every Tuesday in October we had a bus load of students visiting from Bassick High School and on Thursdays a group of 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> graders visit from Dunbar's Light House Program. These visits will continue weekly throughout the year.

Newfield Staff received safety training on "Slips, Trips, & Falls" to raise the level of awareness of the causes and to avoid or prevent them. Branch Manager received training on "First Reporting and Accident

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Investigation” to gain knowledge on the timely reporting and investigations of work-related accidents. These workshops were conducted in conjunction with the City’s Benefits Administration and PMA.

Branch Manager Nykia, LA Breta H. (East Side) and YS Librarian Alexis joined AKA and visiting HBCU colleges, Sororities, and local organizations for the “Oh the Places You Will Grow” college fair for Connecticut high school students held at HCC. Students participated in a panel discussion with Michael Rainey Jr., Actor; Seen in the hit TV series Power and Power Book II. Students and parents also participated in a series of workshops and events held throughout the day. Newfield Staff assisted with the writing workshop with the use of BPL Chromebooks.

Newfield ended October with a Spook-tacular Halloween Party for children and families. Lead by YS Librarian Alexis, with the assistance of LA Latara, and Branch Manager Nykia. Families decorated cookies and cupcakes, listened to music, and enjoyed pizza and pictures and other treats.

Newfield Library continued to host its regular programs during the month of October.

## Children’s Events:

**Creation Station:** Monster Cookies: children decorated and personalized Halloween themed sugar cookies.

**Pumpkin Decorating:** Children & families spent the day painting and decoration special pumpkins pick at Jones Farm by YS Librarian Alex Y.

**Little Readers Storytime:** Monday Little Readers Storytime presented to children, caregivers and teachers. The children enjoy Halloween stories, rhymes, and song and most of all playtime with their favorite toys.

**Lego Club:** Monday Lego Club. Children used their imaginations to create works of art.

**Coding for Kids:** Coding lesson continued with robots borrowed from Middletown Service Center. Dash & Dot Robots. The children are able to make the robot follow their commands through block chain coding with a tablet or laptop. Ozobots are robots that can follow commands through color code detection. They can also follow code commands through a tablet or laptop with block chain coding languages.

## Teen Events:

**Table Top Thursdays:** Teens enjoy table top games that include card and board games

**Anime Club:** Teens watch and discuss popular Anime and Mango series.
