October was a jampacked month. Kickoff for the Digital Navigator program brought several requests for participation. Monika Anton was and is extra busy juggling those appointments. In her spare time, she started a Job Board with employment information. Yoga is back with our popular volunteer instructor, and an artist has volunteered several programs for the fall, starting with Fall Paint, so popular we had to turn people away. We welcomed the post-Covid return of Nikki Vogele and her Strange Happening (scary stories for adults- always a favorite). Nancy's Stone's Virtual Adult Book Discussion tackled *The Zahir* by Coelho, while the Watermark group discussed *The Weight of Ink* by Kadish.

It was all hands on deck for our Halloween activities. First came bag stuffing (hundreds of bags- by North staff and any volunteers that crossed the threshold) with lots of activity sheets, library information and giveaways. Then Dana H and Larry F spent a Thursday evening greeting over 200 families at the Winthrop School Trunk or Treat. Then came the Halloween Hullabaloo: a huge daylong event shared with the Bridgeport Youth Sports Academy. There were so many activities inside and outside! Coach Don arranged for a couple of face painters inside the library. We showed movies. Bina told stories. We had several craft options and so many families crafting. Bina also provided enough donations from her various national award committee work that we had hundreds of titles kids could choose from to keep a book. North Branch had over 706 visitors that day, including one poor young man trying to study for a firefighter test. We found a secluded study room for him away from the general melee!

Our regular programs happened too! Class visits, Lawyers, Vaccines, Mindfulness, Forest bathing, Little Bears and all the rest, including another successful Bridgeport Community Historical Society program, "Grover Cleveland's Rubber Jaw" a presentation by author and retired UNH Professor Stephen Spignesi, from his book about unusual, unexpected, unbelievable but all-true facts about America's Presidents.

Regular work continued as well, and in spite of some absences over the course of the month, we were able to help East Side during an emergency. We remain at a critically short staffing level. We had some additional "anniversaries" this month. Bina W celebrated 25 years with BPL, and Paula Keegan, 38 years.
