- Pettit completed her course with the Univ. of Wisconsin on genealogy for librarians. Pettit felt the class was beneficial and it addressed many of the materials we use in the BHC.
- Library Assistant Michael Hawkins continued his work on two newer, but ongoing projects: creating indexes for the department's larger newspaper clippings by subject collections in preparation for filming and scanning by Advantage Preservation and scanning items from the BHC postcard collection that have not yet been fully cataloged or made available online.
