# Highlights RandR:

#### **Special Programs:**

- BuildOn Program hosted by a non-profit organization that provides volunteer opportunities in the community for high school students. This organization also help educates students about social injustice issues.
- Access Health CT. Their goal is to help decrease the number of individuals that do not have healthcare. They also inform resident about how they can improve their health.

#### Ongoing Programs:

- Adult game night
- Adult book club
- ESL group talk on Saturdays

#### Collections:

- Continue weeding in various areas have started with the non-fiction collection.
- Book carts have been created in Baker & Taylor for purchase.

#### Outreach and Networking:

Andre O'Connor 14 participants for tech help, both in person and virtually. David Morales helped 6 people with tech help. There was a total of 22 responses for the Digital Navigator Program questionnaire.

#### Concerns:

• Staffing is improved but Saturdays are still an issue. There are still times where only one staff member is on, and HC sometimes also only has 1 person alone on the 2<sup>nd</sup> fl, which is not safe.

#### BHC:

- Assistant Archivist Jaime Pettit -ongoing continued her training in both IS and the BHC. Pettit is
  currently editing 300 + catalog records for photographs in PastPerfect, the BHC's collections
  management software. She is also editing some oral history digital files for online presentation.
  Her work on surveying and describing the BHC's Civil War related materials continues. Pettit
  has also scanned photographs using the BHC's standards manual. She continues to field
  reference questions on site and via email in order to familiarize herself with the department's
  considerable resources.
- Pettit continued to write and assist with posting publicity for the BHC's upcoming programs.
- Library Assistant Michael Hawkins continued his work on two newer, but ongoing projects:
   creating indexes for the department's larger newspaper clippings by subject collections in
   preparation for filming and scanning by Advantage Preservation, and scanning items from the
   BHC postcard collection that have not yet been fully cataloged or made available online.
   Michael will soon start a new newspaper related inventory index for the BHC's hard copy
   newspaper collection.

#### **HC Collections:**

Deaccessions – ongoing; work on selected secondary sources on 7<sup>th</sup> floor continued.

#### HC Outreach (ongoing)

- Third year Yale Univ. doctoral candidate Amanda Rivera continued her work interviewing members of Bridgeport's Puerto Rican community about bi-lingual education, especially in the 1970s. BHC is providing equipment and also garnering the interviews from her research for the permanent collection.
- One professor from SUNY Albany and one doctoral candidate visited to use manuscripts collections pertinent to post-war Bridgeport planning and development.
- A high school student has been writing an article on the Mexican American community for the Grassroots Historians program.

#### **Concerns**:

• BHC now has doors open to the public Wednesdays-Fridays, with appointments on Saturdays. The department continues to limit Saturday appointments in order to serve in IS. Some weekday time was spent serving in IS as well.

#### **YOUTH SERVICES**

#### **Special Programs:**

- Tuesday, August 1st, White Memorial Conservation Center delivered their Do The Locomotion program thanks to the generosity of the Friends of the Bridgeport Public Library (35 kids, 18 adults)
- Saturday, August 5th, Jay Reidy performed his Magic of Summer Reading program, thanks to the generosity of the Friends of the Bridgeport Public Library (20 kids, 12 adults)
- Thursday, August 24th, Youth Services held our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Lego Party; complete with bingo, Lego building, crafts, book displays, and treats. It was a big success with our patrons (38 kids, 23 adults)
- Wednesday, August 30th, the youth department had a Back to School Storytime & Craft. (6 kids, 2 adults).

# Ongoing Programs:

- Taslima delivered the August Little Learners program on Tuesday mornings. The program continues to be well-attended.
- Monday Crafternoons and Lego Club take place weekly, both programs are wellattended.

# Outreach:

- Friday, August 18th, Taslima attended the Back-to-School event at Skane School, along with Paula Keegan and Laura Matthews. They spoke with over 30 families.
- Saturday, August 26th, Kristin attended the Justice Impact Back to School Jam/Backpack Giveaway at Seaside Park, along with Joy Smoak & Sirila Lucero. They spoke with approximately 50 families.

#### Collection & Displays:

 In August, the Youth Department had book displays for dinosaurs (commemorating the anniversary of dinosaur tracks being discovered in Connecticut); wild animals (tiein with live animal program); Lego/Ninjago (tie-in with Lego Party); & Back to School (Bridgeport Public Schools began their 23-24 school year on August 28th).

#### Concerns:

- Burroughs-Saden Children's Department signed up 143 kids for summer reading this year, a 66% increase over our total last year! We were delighted to see so many kids come in to show us the books they read & collect their prizes.
- We welcomed Kate Mozier-Tichy as our new Teen Librarian on Monday, August 28th. We are very excited to have her here so we can begin implementing new and exciting programming for our Bridgeport teens!
- The Teen Room computers are all back in working order just in time for back to school!
