Youth Services:

We currently have an exhibition of self-portraits and poems from two 3rd grade classrooms from Dunbar School in the Children's room. The classrooms created the artwork under the guidance of art instructors from New Caanan's Silvermine Arts Center. The self-portraits are beautiful and add a delightful charm to the room. They will be on display until the end of May.

We had a visit from 3rd grade students from Tisdale school. For National Poetry Month, I introduced the students to poetry and the structure of poems by performing a read aloud of Gwendolyn Brook's *We Are Shining* picture book. After the read aloud, children were guided in creating their own poet-trees. They created and wrote their own poems inside of a tree template on cardstock and painted their trees using watercolors. The students left very happy and excited about poems and artwork. Also, all the students with the exception of one, checked out books at the conclusion of their visit.

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
