Don Wilson of <u>Bridgeport Youth Lacrosse (Sports Academy)</u> is always thinking of ways to collaborate. For our Easter family indoor/outdoor event, Don's teams collected donations of candy, and stuffed bags for giveaways. Large groups of families were drawn into the library.

<u>DIG USA</u> sponsored a five-day Spring Break Chess Camp for teens and tweens. Chess lessons alternated with outdoor sports time. The weather was perfect all week. This program was worth about \$6500 and cost us nothing. Snacks were provided through <u>LITT</u> funding since some of the kids were in the LITT age bracket. Our regular Chess programs continued.

The <u>Westport Country Playhouse</u> sent "Jenny" to read *Pout Pout Fish* and make a Pout Pout Fish using big googly eyes. Participants received coupons for \$5.00 tickets to see the production in May. This was a big hit!

Programs like these would not happen without the generosity and love of our children and teens, as well as all our patrons, shown by our many partners. First Serve Tennis has started their spring program.

From Monika's notes: Tax Assistance finished up. A new regular multigenerational craft program series began with birdhouse building. Yoga, Quilting and other regular programs continue to work out well. The monthly art program, Lawyers in Libraries, and the self-help
