BYL and GG also hosted a lovely WHM fancy celebration Tea with activities and delicious food. Other special programs went well (see the very full list!). Tax Assistance appointments were full, and our generous AARP volunteers have added another day in April.

Regular programs such as Little Bears Storytime went well. The beginner and intermediate level groups of Literacy Volunteers' Learn English series are growing. The new C2 Education program, Study Skills and College Prep, is too. Preparation for the big solar eclipse (Bina is a NASA Partner Eclipse Ambassador; Joel is her solar attaché) is at the forefront, as are other upcoming programs for spring and planning for summer.

Staffing needs eased a bit more with the arrival of new Library Assistant I Paula Carlson. She is a very welcome, cheerful and helpful addition to the North staff. Despite the staffing crunch, the entire North staff is dedicated to providing the best customer service possible for all our patrons.
