Tax Assistance continued, but with a loss. Hank Hofflich, a volunteer for many years, and our volunteer coordinator for a substantial part of that time, passed away. He will be missed. Tax Assistance by AARP volunteers in person, and SHU VITA remotely, helps hundreds of patrons every year. All programming went well (see the full list). BCHS has switched from evening programs to afternoon to increase senior attendance. It seems to be working. A planned Room Box series had to be rescheduled to May, but interest is very high. Saturday Yoga attendance continues to grow.

Joel's Celebrate Herstory DVD display was popular, as well as Paula C's Spring into a Good Book and Staff Favorites options. Deb S covered the displays in Children's with Women's History Month, Ramadan and Passover suggestions, while Monika had all things Irish on display for St Patrick's day in addition to Women's History Month. Donated puzzles have helped us keep up with the rapid puzzle-doers at the puzzle table, and everyone enjoys Joel's original poems he posts there. The staff continues with ongoing projects such as relabeling, weeding, shifting, adding and inventorying. Collection building is happening all the time, and everyone takes a part. Program planning, promoting and implementing is important work that goes on as well. I announced my retirement coming up in June, so staff is preparing for that as well.

Bina and Joel represented the Library at G Johnson School's Community Resource Night. Joel reports the pizza they had was (gasp) *almost* as good as Pepe's. On a day off, Bina relayed: "Kristin Munley, former BPL librarian Jan Fisher, and I went to NYC for the Audies Gala—the awarding of the awards for the best audiobooks of the year. All three of us have been judges for this award for several years now. Held at Pier 60 in the Chelsea Piers made for a lovely spot right on the river. The most exciting part was that Whoopi Goldberg was there to accept her award for narrating her own book."

We are still awaiting programming technology upgrades. We are looking forward to completed roof work, and the beginning of this year's garden. Maintenance is starting to prepare the front area of the library for the artists who will work on the new mural in June. Once completed, the mural will "greet" everyone as they come up the driveway. Summer is coming and we are planning for that as well.
