October was a busy month! Geri Floyd and her Fairfield County Coalition for voter registration hosted a table in the lobby to encourage everyone to register and vote (see photo). We handed out many tickets for the Council of Italian-American Societies of Greater Bridgeport 35<sup>th</sup> annual U.S. Marine Band concert, and encouraged everyone to also attend the Library's Orquesta Afinke Concert later in the month. Bina W. attended that concert to help. Paula Carlson and Deb Stanley joined Beardsley's Elvis Molina and Board member Tom Errichetti at the Columbus Day Parade and handed out hundreds of books to parade goers (see photo). Debbie also helped staff the Library table at the downtown Farmers Market one day.

We had our Halloween Hullabaloo with our partners Bridgeport Youth Lacrosse and Sports Academy and Gifted Girls. Those many hands were essential for success, with an attendance over 800. The library events included face painting, rock creatures, a coloring contest, and trick or treating through the library. The photo booth was very popular, and a few of our props have mysteriously disappeared...(see photos).

Our regular and special programs went well as usual (see our list). Keeping our programs running smoothly requires much time, patience, and attention to detail. The garden is winding down but many patrons still enjoyed scooping up a tomato or two on their way out the door after checkout. Paula K introduced a patron to baby okra one afternoon. He's one of our daily walkers and was standing outside the garden wondering what it was. Now he has a seed pod for his garden and is very excited. Digital Navigator and Notary appointments kept Monika quite busy. Joel H has been helping with the tech assistance. He has also decorated the displays with some beautiful handmade leaves, adding dimension and depth.

Displays included spooky and Halloween books, TV adaptations of books (Paula C), artifacts from the 1939 World's Fair in NY (Joel H made another great banner for this lobby display), fall reading to curl up with, Columbus, movies for October (Joel H reports that Scarlett Johanssen's "Ghost in the Shell" went out 4 times while on display). Joel's special Spooky Season bookmarks had patrons double dipping... Hispanic Heritage Month ended and Italian Heritage Month began.

Dana H noted that several staff members were involved in the major weeding project of DVDs that haven't circulated in many years. Bina and Debbie have been weeding in the children's department as well, and relabeling titles with faded labels. The work of the Library never ends! We are already planning next summer's reading program, as well as restarting 1000 Books Before Kindergarten.

We are still hoping to do some major pruning and trimming of the overgrown shrubs outside the windows and the vines crawling up the walls. Some shrubs have been trimmed back in readiness for the upcoming Bridgeport mural project. We are quite chilly some days waiting for the boiler to be replaced. We are looking forward to the roof project. We are also looking at ways to make the Madison Avenue sign more noticeable.

Some technology glitches are still in need of fixing. We continue to look forward to updating our programming technology soon.

Fall is in full swing in spite of the boomerang weather. We are planning for programs through this year and into 2025.
