Outreach Committee:

The Outreach Committee ended its summer participation at the Farmer's Market the first week in Oct. We were able to talk to a lot of residents about our services and to meet a lot of community organizations.

We attended MIRA Resource Fair that was held at City Hall Annex.

The Digital Navigator Pilot Program launched at Bridgeport Public Library Oct. 1, 2022. In Conn. There is such a need for all residents to have the ability to afford internet services and to have devices that will help them in securing a job, obtaining health care and ability to reach out to family members. In Bridgeport many are not able to do such, there is a digital divide in certain population and that divide is widening daily. Many libraries in Conn. And across the nation have implemented various programs to address this divide. Bridgeport library realize that there is a need among the people they service to provide resources that will help with what they need; besides one-on-one, a device to practice on for a couple of months, free of charge. Over 140 residents have signed up for this program. Each branch has someone on staff who is part of the Digital Navigator program. The staff works around their duties and schedule residents for a least a 1hour session for how many sessions the residents desired. This program will run until the end of June 2023
